If the base word ends in /t/ sound (<t> or <te>), add <ion> to make it <tion> = /sh ə n/

complete completion abduct abduction

If the base word has <mit> at the end, remove <mit> and add for the /shə n/ sound.

ad*mit* admi*ssion* abduction

cian

If a word is the name of a profession with the $/\sinh n/$ sound, it takes <cian> to make the $/\sinh n/$ sound.

magic magician politician

s+ion

i) If the base word ends in the /d/ sound, remove <d> or <de> and add <sion> to make it sound <sion> = /sh = n/ or /zh = n/.

inva*de* inva*sion* exten*d* exten*sion*

ii) If the base word ends in <s>,<se> sound, add <ion> to make itsound <sion> = /sh ə n/ or /zh ən/.
